## Grand Knight's Report

At this point, all councils are lagging. The semi-annual audit is due February 15. Please welcome our new Brother Knights. Be sure to invite them to our meetings and participate in our activities. Please offer your assistance in helping our new members and not-so-new members receive their second and third degrees. Upcoming 3<sup>rd</sup> Degrees include February 8 in Ashburn, February 15 in South Boston, and February 22 in Harrisonburg. The 3<sup>rd</sup> degree in Harrisonburg is the closest so far. Let's try to get as many 2<sup>nd</sup> degree members to go to that degree. The degree starts at 11 a.m. We would have to leave here around 9:00 or 9:30 in the morning. Our Worthy State Deputy wants all councils in Virginia to schedule a Membership Blitz for March, but our council's membership drive is ongoing. The Charlottesville Catholic School Spring Fling is set for Friday, April 25. CCS asked our council to participate with volunteers. Joe Murray and I attended a meeting at CCS. They want us to provide volunteers from 4:00-7:00 that night. The PTO specifically requested a Fish Fry. We have access to the cafeteria kitchen and outlets to operate the heat lamps. In addition to serving fish, we will also serve chicken and French fries. The PTO is anticipating 100 or more people. They plan to sell tickets in advance so we have a better idea of the number of people we'll be serving. We also offered to assist with parking. We will need at least 3 people to help with food and 6 to help out with parking. If you can help, please contact me.

Our council collected about \$3,000 and ordered 12 boxes this winter for the Coats for Kids drive and distributed them to the local churches. As long as it is cold, we have plenty of time to make donations.

CCS would sell the tickets for the food and our council would get the money for the food sold. We offered to help with parking. We will need at least 9 people (3 people cooking and 6 people to help with parking) between 4:00 and 7:00 that night. The CCS PTO wants the Knights to help very badly, and we like the enthusiasm they are showing us. Since we are hoping to use CCS for a third degree sometime in 2014-15, and since we had a lot of good discussion and enthusiasm at our business meeting in January, we plan to commit to this. ## **COATS FOR KIDS UPDATE**

This is the fourth year our council is collecting money for the Coats for Kids drive. Last year, we collected over \$4,000 to buy coats for every child in need at Holy Comforter, Church of the Incarnation, and St. George. We also sent additional coats to the storm-ravaged Northeast after Super Storm Sandy.

This year we've raised about \$3,000. 12 cases of coats have been ordered and distributed to St. George, Incarnation, and Holy Comforter. The cost of the coats went up to \$18.33/coat this year for these high quality coats, which are brand new from a major manufacturer.
