Grand Knight's Report

Going forward, upcoming degrees will be posted in the newsletter. After July, there will be a 3rd Degree in Charlottesville. All 2nd degree members should plan on taking this upcoming degree. If you want to take any degree, please let me know in advance before the date of the degree. I need to notify the District Deputy and the Grand Knight of the council where the degree is to take place. A traveler's card should be made up for the candidate to take to the degree, and your dues must be up to date.

Fr. Joseph Mary, Holy Comforter's pastor, has agreed to be our council's chaplain. The bishop approved it. Thanks to Jim Morrisard for volunteering to be our Warden to finish the Columbian year. A representative from Camp Holiday Trails spoke at the Officers Meeting April 1. The camp has been in Charlottesville for 40 years and hosts children with various medical problems, ranging from Cystic Fibrosis, amputation, neurological impairments, sickle cell anemia, and various kinds of cancer. CHT offers a free camp experience to kids from around this area and all over the East Coast. The Valley Cursillo uses CHT at least twice per year. Camp Holiday Trails works mostly with our parishes and is asking the Knights of Columbus if we are willing to help extend their unique camp. It's in need of renovation. We would like to help them raise money to renovate the camp. How can we involve the Knights along with the parishes to accomplish this? I'm looking for a volunteer to handle and coordinate calls from the Pavilion staff and call volunteers to work the beer truck during Friday Nights After 5 this summer.

I have fliers for the Walk for Life, which will take place on April 13th at St. Thomas Aquinas. I have application forms for sponsorship pledges for anyone that wants to participate. More details below. Details for a Knights of Columbus Dance in May will be posted soon. I've been communicating with James Repp of the Pregnancy Centers of Central Virginia. He told me he would like to speak to our council. A date has been tentatively set for the June 3rd officers meeting. I spoke to Janie Eckman from Without Borders. She is asking our council to help them raise funds in the fall. Without Borders assists Hispanic people with general legal and immigrations issues. We will resume Family of the Month/Year and Knight of the Month/Year. Ballots will be distributed at the meetings. April 7th is the Holy Comforter Communion Breakfast. Tickets are \$5 for adults, \$2 for children, and a maximum of \$15 for families. Tickets will be sold after Masses, through the church office, and at the door. The KOVAR pancake breakfast will be held at the Church of the Incarnation parish hall on April 21 from 9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. Please contact Norm Balwinski at nbalwinski@comcast.net to volunteer. By June, we need to figure out what cards we need for Keep Christ in Christmas and have an idea who is going to sell them after mass at each church. The cards need to be ordered by mail. By getting them in person, we get a bonus pack which contains the old cards from previous years. We already have 16 cards from last Christmas.
