By special permission granted by State Deputy Tony Fortunato, Fr. James J Scanlon Council in association with District 10 will be hosting a 2nd and 3rd Degree Exemplification on Saturday, June 7 at St. John the Evangelist School Building in Highland Springs (803 West Nine Mile Road 23075). Originally, St. Edward's Council 06546 / District 8 had hosting duties; however, due to building repairs, it has been moved.

All GPS systems should be able to pick up the location of Council 6936; however, it is exit 197A if travelling on Interstate 64 and Exit 31A if travelling on Interstate 295. While on VA-156, continue until you make it to Nine Mile Road and make the turn toward the Shell Gas Station (with 7-11 / CVS in your rear view mirror – if you pass Highland Springs HS on your left, you are going in the correct direction). The church will appear on the left hand side in a couple of miles).

Please note that there will be separate entry locations for candidates and observers. The dress code for these exemplifications would be coat and tie. The 2nd Degree will begin at 9:15 in the classroom section of the school building; therefore, we would like to have the candidates arrive around 8:30-8:45 so that they can be registered. The 3rd Degree will begin at 11:00 in the community center (other side of the school building). Candidates should arrive at 10:15 for this degree for registration purposes. If possible, we would prefer those who are already 2nd Degree members to be observers during the 9:15 2nd Degree if at all possible.

VIRGINIA CATHOLIC CONFERENCE

Attend the 2014 National Marriage March June 19 in Washington, D.C.

Your presence and voice are needed now more than ever in support of true marriage! Plan to attend the 2014 Marriage March on June 19th in Washington, D.C. The March, which begins at 11:00 a.m., is being organized by the National Organization for Marriage and is co-sponsored by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops and many other organizations. On June 19th, allies from across the nation will join to show our judges and elected officials that many Americans stand for marriage between a man and a woman.

The past several months have seen a flurry of federal court rulings aimed at redefining marriage. In addition to the *Bostic* case here in Virginia that was heard on May 13 in a federal appeals court in Richmond, cases were recently considered in many other states, including Oklahoma, Utah, Arkansas, Oregon, and Pennsylvania. Some legal experts predict that one or more of these cases will eventually be considered by the U.S. Supreme Court.

The USCCB has encouraged the faithful to participate in the Marriage March, which occurs just before the annual Fortnight for Freedom. In an April 7 letter, USCCB leaders wrote, *"This year's March for Marriage will provide an ideal occasion for participants to celebrate and give public witness to the unique meaning of marriage as the union of one man and one woman at a time when the religious liberties and conscience rights of those who promote and defend marriage are increasingly threatened."*

RSVP (REFUND SUPPORT VOCATIONS PROGRAM)

Through the Knights of Columbus Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP), councils, assemblies and Squires circles "adopt" one or more seminarians or postulants and provide them with financial assistance and moral support. RSVP money is used by seminarians and those in religious formation for tuition and books, car insurance and maintenance, travel during vacations, emergency expenditures and other living expenses. Knights provide more than financial support, though. Members write letters to students, sponsor dinners for them, invite them to join the Order and, most importantly, pray for vocations.

Last year, financial help from 2,628 councils, assemblies and circles to future priests, sisters and brothers, exceeded \$3 million. Since 1981 the Order has provided more than \$52.9 million in aid through RSVP, helping more than 85,900 men and women follow their vocations. Qualifying councils and assemblies receive a \$100 refund for every \$500 donated, up to a limit of \$2,000 donated to an individual.

CATHOLIC STUDENT TUITION ASSISTANCE

The Bishop is spearheading an effort to raise money for tuition assistance for Catholic school students. The Virginia Education Improvement Scholarship Tax Credit program has the benefit of providing a significant Virginia state tax credit to both individuals and businesses that make a donation through this program, while providing funding for tuition assistance for low income families to obtain a Catholic education. The funds can also be directed to our local Catholic school such that the donation benefits families from our own community. Deacon Bob Griffin has been working with the K of C councils in the Richmond area to help inform people of this opportunity.
