
KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS RECRUITING DRIVES COMING IN OCTOBER

BROTHER KNIGHT FATHER CHET PASSES AWAY




On Thursday, July 31, The Reverend Monsignor Chester Paul Michael, who was affectionately known as Father Chet, passed away in Richmond at the age of 97. Saint Thomas Aquinas hosted the funeral the night of August 6 with Bishop DiLorenzo as the Main Celebrant. Msgr. Chet was a 4th Degree Knight and was a huge part of this community. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1942 and became pastor of Holy Comforter in 1972. Father Chet brought Cursillo to the Diocese in Richmond in 1963 and served as Spiritual Director of many Cursillo retreats over a period of almost 50 years. He authored many books as well.

BROTHER KNIGHT ED MORRIS PASSES AWAY



Brother Knight Edward Joseph Morris passed away in Charlottesville August 13 at the age of 94. A funeral mass was celebrated August 19 at Church of the Incarnation with a 4th Degree Honor Guard, which included Joe Murray, Jim Morrisard, and Phil Carr under the direction of District Warden Rick Dowsett. Ed joined the Knights in 1946, the same year he married his wife of 61 years, Rosemary. He was an Honorary Life member of our council with 68 years as a Knight. Brother Morris became a 4th Degree Knight in 1985. Ed was a long-time member of Holy Comforter and Incarnation since he and Rosemary moved to Charlottesville from New York in 1958. Ed was an Army Air Corps Veteran of World War II, 15th Air Force Division, where he was a top turret gunner on a B-24 Aircraft.

RESURRECTION CHALICE PROGRAM FOR VOCATIONS

Brother Knights who are Members of Holy Comforter Church,

The purpose of the Chalice Program is to encourage families to pray and promote vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life. The consecrated Chalice is a tangible reminder of this special intention for the Church. Praying for vocations is the most powerful way to support vocations. A vocation is a call from the Holy Spirit, a gift from God that is nurtured in prayer. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to our Father those men and women whom He is calling to follow Him in a very special way. The Vocations Chalice Prayer Program at Holy Comforter is simple. Just sign up on the calendar that is on the credenza. You will be called the beginning of the week as a reminder. During Mass you will be called forward to receive the Chalice to take home for the week to offer prayers for vocations. Prayers will be included in the Chalice box to start you off. Bring the Chalice back the following week when it will be given to the next Parishioners. This is such a beautiful way to pray for priestly vocations.

The Second Vatican Council instructs us that it is the job of the laity to pray for an increase in vocations. We are asking all of our parishioners to join together and pray for vocations.

Each Sunday, a parishioner or parishioners, will take home a consecrated chalice and use it as a focal point while praying daily for an increase in religious vocations. In successive weeks, the chalice is passed to other parishioners. We all are well aware of the urgent need for an increase in religious vocations. This is an opportunity for our Knights of Columbus at Holy Comforter to spearhead the Resurrection Chalice Program for Vocations; and thus by our example, encourage other parishioners to join us in this effort.

RSVP (REFUND SUPPORT VOCATIONS PROGRAM)

Through the Knights of Columbus Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP), councils, assemblies and Squires circles "adopt" one or more seminarians or postulants and provide them with financial assistance and moral support. RSVP money is used by seminarians and those in religious formation for tuition and books, car insurance and maintenance, travel during vacations, emergency expenditures and other living expenses. Knights provide more than financial support, though. Members write letters to students, sponsor dinners for them, invite them to join the Order and, most importantly, pray for vocations.

Last year, financial help from 2,628 councils, assemblies and circles to future priests, sisters and brothers, exceeded \$3 million. Since 1981 the Order has provided more than \$52.9 million in aid through RSVP, helping more than 85,900 men and women follow their vocations. Qualifying councils and assemblies receive a \$100 refund for every \$500 donated, up to a limit of \$2,000 donated to an individual.

FOCUS MISSIONARY SUPPORT OPPORTUNITY

I received the email below from Frederick Lothers and met with him in person to discuss FOCUS. If you've never heard of FOCUS before, it stands for Fellowship of Catholic University Students. It's a nationwide program involving hundreds of missionaries serving on college campuses (public and private) across the country.

Frederick is a Brother Knight (a member of the other Charlottesville council) and a UVa graduate who just started his first year as a FOCUS missionary at New York University (NYU) in Manhattan. My name is Frederick Lothers, and beginning this year, I am serving as a full-time Catholic missionary with the Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS). I have been assigned to serve at New York University in Manhattan.

I joined the Knights of Columbus in 2012, just a few weeks after I came into the Church at Easter. I wish that my studies had allowed more time to stay involved at my local council, but I'm hoping to get more involved in New York now that I've graduated from UVA. I enjoyed the work I did with the Knights when I was able. I'm not sure if you're familiar with FOCUS, but it is now the largest Catholic outreach program in the United States. As a FOCUS missionary, I have to fund-raise 100% of my salary. In partnership with the university parish and/or Newman Center, FOCUS missionaries are sent in teams of at least four (two men and two women) to host large group outreach events, weekly Bible studies, and offer one-on-one mentoring with college students to bring them into a growing relationship with Jesus Christ and His Church, and equip them for a lifetime of Christ-centered evangelization, discipleship, and friendship in which they lead others to do the same. I felt called to serve with FOCUS, rather than going straight to work in my field of study (aerospace engineering), because I saw what was happening to college in the radically secular modern college campus. It is estimated that between 70% and 80% of students raised in the Church have fallen away by the end of college. FOCUS was founded precisely to try to reverse that trend.

KOVAR – YOUR CHARITY NEEDS YOU

The needs of Virginians with intellectual disabilities are significant. A few of the grants awarded by KOVAR within the past year include:

- \$50,000 to Special Olympics Virginia to enable athletes to display their talents
- \$20,000 to Canterbury Group Home to replace windows and flooring
- \$20,000 to Chesapeake Service Systems to expand a laundry operation that employs Virginians with intellectual disabilities
- \$14,800 to Grafton Integrated Health Center to implement equestrian therapy and vocational training
- \$16,930 to Community Living Alternatives to replace furniture in several group homes
- \$18,220 to Hope House Foundation to renovate several kitchens in an apartment building for people with ID

Unfortunately, the trend in collections for KOVAR by the councils is on a downward slide. Collections have gone from \$480,000 two years ago, to \$466,000 a year ago, to \$402,000 the past year. KOVAR relies on your increased support to reverse this trend so that Virginians with intellectual disabilities can enjoy an improved quality of life.

Media commercials for the Wounded Warrior Project ask you to donate \$19 per month. If you want to be a Partner in Hope for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, they suggest you donate \$25 per month.

“What if” each Council through their fund raising efforts contributed \$1 per week per member ---that comes to \$52 per member per year. At that rate, a council with 100 members could raise \$5,200.
