## ANOTHER POTENTIAL CHARITY IDEA AT INCARNATION

The Church of the Incarnation has a Tree Of Life. Parishioners can permanently memorialize or honor a loved one, family member, or a friend by making a donation for a leaf on the *Tree of Life*. The tree will be located in the Narthex and will be installed just in time to celebrate the Easter Season.

Parish families are also invited to sponsor one of the many flowerbeds around our parish property. Families are welcome to purchase the flowers and plant them, donate the flowers, or make a donation and Incarnation will purchase the flowers and plant them. A sign will be placed on each flowerbed with the name of the sponsoring family. A donation for the flowerbed is a cheaper option for only \$25.

Perhaps our council can make donation in this fashion each year (choosing a different person to honor each year - Ellis Flinn for 2013?).
